Well it is with real pleasure that I can report NZ Water Polo is back in black! It has been a remarkable two years of very hard work by the team and it is a credit to the management and my fellow board members which has allowed us to achieve this outcome. Last year, I said the board had set itself a conservative recapitalisation programme of 3 years. In 13 months (July 2010) we achieved a break even position and have had positive cash flow since then. In essence your board has delivered what it said it would and in the worst financial environment since 1929/30.

I believe the NZ Water Polo community should be proud of its board and what it has achieved for the sport without rancour or washing its laundry in public. Sports history, in New Zealand and probably globally, is littered with administrative fall-out after negative outcomes are recorded. As a board we appreciate the confidence you have shown in us, and allowing us to apply our learning's for the benefit of the sport.

The financial milestones achieved have been based on running some very successful tournaments in New Zealand and I acknowledge the volunteers, without whom we would not have been able to achieve the outcomes we have. It is a testament to your efforts which allowed this to happen and I would like to take this opportunity to collectively thank each and every one of you for your contribution, wherever you were in the competitions, pool side, administration, team or traveller welfare, etc. The lasting impressions that each one of you have made with our visitors has left us with a very positive legacy and one which I hope will help NZ Water Polo secure a major international tournament at some stage in the very near future.

This is not a time however to rest on our laurels. The budget for 2011/12 is tight and will need to be carefully managed. We do not have any significant tournaments on the calendar for this financial year, although we may be able to host some teams before the Junior Worlds in Perth. What it will allow us to do however is to begin to focus on the future again. Key initiatives will be reviewed and if funding is found, implemented. Some of these include Flippa Ball growth, High Performance support, Referee and Coach Development to name the main opportunities.

I would also like to take this opportunity to express our collective regret at the situation Christchurch Water Polo and the city finds itself in. If there is any support we can give to our colleagues and fellow competitors in their hour of need then we must do so. NZ Water Polo will be the poorer if Christchurch is not supported at this time. This support can come in many different forms and it is up to us to ask "what can we do for you or what do you need from us right now?"

The 2010 Women's Water Polo World Cup was of course held in Christchurch and concluded about 2 weeks before the first major earthquake hit in September last year. FINA were very pleased with the way the tournament was run and gave us a rating of 2, on a scale of 1-10, 1 Excellent and no faults to 10 being " well they'll never get a tournament to run again in our lifetime". This is very pleasing and acknowledged as such by SPARC, The Ministry of Economic Development and Christchurch City Council. The organisation and flow of the tournament was excellent. The interesting results meant all those who participated in Christchurch actually qualified for the 14th FINA World Championships played in Shanghai 2011. Once again a big thank you to all those who helped make this a success.

The 2010 PanPacs were the 20th anniversary of the tournament and arguably the largest celebration of Water Polo held in the Southern Hemisphere. We had 132 teams apply to take part but needed to scale this back to about 118.We are hopeful that the development of new pool space in Auckland will allow us to expand the competition in the future.

One of the positives that came out of the 2009 troubles was the establishment of the Chairmen's forum. This forum held twice this year created an opportunity to share ideas and voice concerns from the wider Water Polo community. One of the benefits of this forum has been the review recently undertaken on the board appointment process, another will be a revamp of the constitution as a whole to make it a more modern and inclusive document focussing on the rules which will govern our sport in the future. The forum of the Chair's is mooted to become a regular forum in perpetuity and is likely to become known as the "Council of Chairs". It is likely this body will have status of its own and be directly linked and governed by the NZWP Constitution. You will have had information on this to consider from the review panel.I would urge this forum to set dates annually so the team at NZWP may be able to approach potential funders to help with the costs associated with attending and running this meeting. In the future this forum may also be one where guest speakers or presenters could attend to discuss and address specific topics of interest

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT continued

To my fellow board members, thank you for your collective contributions this year. Governance of NZ Water Polo has become more structured and particular thanks must be recorded for the wisdom and guidance from co-opted member David Jackson.

The NZ Water Polo Foundation will become a reality this year, whether we achieve charity status or not. The lack of a substantial capital fund has hindered the development of our sport in New Zealand. Having recently returned from the World Championships in Shanghai, unless we break the cycle of our current participation strategy, as a country we will never be able to compete on the World stage at a senior level. New Zealand players have the Skill and Talent but we need to do things differently in the future. Last year we applied to the Charities Commission to have NZWP Inc become registered as a Charity. You all participated in a referendum which gave the board unanimous approval to proceed with our application. At the time of writing this report we are still waiting for the decision from the Commission. Given the changes we have made to our constitution, we believe it is highly probable our application will be approved. If this happens it will be a significant milestone for NZ Water Polo and its future. I am looking forward to the Commission's determination with great anticipation.

Finally, I like to record the sports thanks to Sir Stephen Tindall our Patron, for his participation and interest during this last year, and highlight again the efforts made by Pam, Russell, Eelco, and Nyree in making NZ Water Polo a great sport to participate in.

The Year in Review

This has been a busy year for the office and our volunteers. We have delivered three internationals with two of those being in consecutive months. Once again the Pan Pacs in July last year were a success and this was followed closely by the Women's World Cup in Christchurch in August. The third event was the World League that was to be held in Christchurch but had to be transferred to Auckland following the February 22 earthquake.

The FINA World Cup was seen as a success by FINA (who rated it 2 out of ten with 1 being the best) the Ministry of Economic Development, SPARC and Christchurch City Council who helped fund the event. Each of the funders has expressed their willingness to support future international events that are of a similar level. We are looking forward at what events might fit their categories and our timeframes.

From these events are developing a best practice manual so that we can build on our delivery for any new events in the future. In addition we are able to look at how these internationals are delivered and transfer elements to our national championships. The goal being to lift the presentation of national championships, to make the event more of a spectacle and therefore more enjoyable for everyone.

Over the last year we have also been able to support our senior national teams financially in the events that we have hosted here in New Zealand.

Flippa Ball

Flippa Ball continues to be a major funding contributor to NZWP. Without this activity we would be so dependent on other funding as to make our position almost untenable.

This has been a mixed year for Flippa Ball. We have waiting lists in some of the leagues and others are struggling to grow. The entry costs of the leagues do not seem to be a factor.

We were expecting to start several new leagues over the last year but due to a number of reasons, one of them being the earthquake of February 22^{nd} , these did not happen. However we did manage to start one a new league at One Tree Hill in Auckland.

We are actively working to develop new leagues in areas that can support good competition.

During the last term we asked the Flippa Ball coordinators to survey the teams with two questions. One of these was "*are the players involved with any other aquatic activities*". The survey results so far indicate that for a substantial portion of these children Flippa Ball may be the only aquatic activity they are involved in. NZ Water Safety New Zealand perceives Flippa Ball as a step up from learn to swim however this appears not to be the case at all. We are waiting on more survey results to be presented.

Funding

Funding is a "gamble'. We are still dependant on funding to provide a significant portion to our operating costs which means that there is still risk for the ongoing stability of the organisation.

There are a number of factors making funding a greater risk for NZWP as a National Sports Organisations (NSO):

- 1. There has been a 10% decrease year on year on the revenue that Gaming Trusts receive therefore there is less money to distribute.
- 2. There is an increase in the portion of funding made available to horse racing again reducing the amount of money the Gaming Trusts can distribute to the community including sport.
- 3. The local councils want funding to be applied locally rather than to an NSO. This may be good for local clubs but it is short sighted for Water Polo when you consider that our NZWP Championships are distributed around the country and that these events bring significant revenue into the local communities.

4. Because of the continuing cases of abuse of the grant systems the Department of Internal Affairs are looking at whether to move funding to local councils or the Lotteries Commission. If that happens we will find the whole funding landscape changed with the risk being that the result may not be to sports benefit.

So all of this translates to more risk to the ongoing viability of NZWP.

Whereas the current funding model is far from perfect it is the system we are used to so we would encourage everyone involved in receiving funding for sport to be rigorous in meeting the regulatory requirements. As always it is the mistakes of the few that cause problems for the rest of us.

Once again we have had considerable support from Southern Trust for Flippa Ball, The Lion Foundation for competitions, NZCT for salaries and SPARC for hosting our international events. Our thanks go to those organizations.

Whenever and wherever possible please continue to support the Trusts and sponsors that support our sport.

Strategy

Currently we have completed a Participation Strategy for Water Polo which has been circulated to the clubs. The process undertaken for this strategy was to record what the various stakeholders in our sport want NZWP to provide. From there we looked at what NZWP needs to be good at and what we need to improve on. This provided the base information for the objectives and initiatives which we are working our way through with the following short update.

Of the 23 initiatives identified in the Participation Strategy four are done, eight are a work in progress and eleven are yet to start. A more detailed update document can be found on the NZWP website under the NZWP Public Documents Tab.

While conducting the process there were two interesting items.

Parents were asked - "Why is water polo important to you?" In general the answers were: "It is important for our children to have opportunities for:

- Fitness & Health Development
- Fun & friendship
- Social Development (responsibility and commitment)
- Learning to play in a group and control emotions"

The second insight was that the majority of our players play for enjoyment. When they stop enjoying they stop playing.

I believe the point is that we (NZWP and the clubs) have to deliver to what our players want at each development level and winning is not necessarily the most important thing.

We are working on the High Performance/National Teams strategy.

Financials

In reviewing the 2011 year with the previous year, 2010, we make the following comments regarding significant differences:

1. **REVENUE CENTRES, Domestic Competition surplus.**

The surplus amount of \$182,256 is made up of both international and domestic competitions. Once the international events surpluses and funding revenue is removed we are left with approximately \$19,000 as the surplus for domestic competitions. This equates to a surplus of approximately \$1,000 per event.

2. REVENUE CENTRES, Flippa Ball.

In the 2010 year there was a large amount of funding and sponsorship, from Gaming Trusts, SPARC and Ribena that was not available in 2011.

3. SERVICE CENTRES, High Performance Surplus / (Loss).

The difference between the years figures in this area reflects the fact that there was less travel for the national teams in the past year.

4. SERVICE CENTRES, Administration Surplus / (Loss).

In the 2010 year there was more funding for head office plus we had funding assistance for Sarah Jenner who was working in the BoP area.

The financial position for the 2010/11 year has had a large contribution from the three international events we have held during the year.

The overall surplus recorded in this document has also been assisted by \$161,000 worth of grants that was carried forward from the previous year. This year we are carrying forward \$61,000 worth of grants.

For the 2001/12 financial year:

- We do not have any international competitions or events that will provide further surpluses.
- The budgeted surplus consists almost entirely of registration fees.
- We do not have any projects, events or situations that have significant financial risk associated with them.

Conclusion

Where would we be without our volunteers?

Water Polo volunteers contribute a huge amount of time and expertise to our sport at all levels – club, centre, national teams and the board. We could not operate without them and they are the reason Water Polo is as popular through the country as it is. Every one of them (you) are as much a hero as the children, youths and adults that play this great sport.

Thank you does not say enough.

Christchurch

I would like to stress once more that our thoughts are with the whole of the Christchurch community in general, and with our water polo friends and families in particular. Our people in Christchurch are phenomenal and the fact that the 15th FINA Women's Water Polo World Cup was a finalist in the 2010 SPARC Event of the Year is a tribute to that.

Officials Development

First of all a big thank you to our referees. Refereeing is hard at the best of times, something we all know but hardly ever acknowledge!

Officials Development is a very important part of our sport and needs and deserves more attention than it presently gets. The goal is to align this area with the Coach Development stages in the near future and in a similar approach.

Officials Development is very similar to Coach Development in the way that 'practise makes perfect'. Here also lays the challenge, as there are only a limited number of games available per official. Teams can practise several times a week, where officials are limited to, mostly, competition/game opportunities.

Achievements in regards to Officials Development over the reporting period have been:

- New theory exams for all grading levels (more extensive and expanded exams, aligned with FINA)
- Pairing-up Approach, where possible, at national championships (less experienced and lower graded referees are paired-up with more experienced and higher graded referees)
- Additional Referee Appraisals at national championships by peers and more experienced and higher graded referees

Club Development

Club Development is an ongoing process and NZ Water Polo does everything it can to provide ongoing support, and even more important ongoing understanding, to its clubs and members. However, *no* is also an answer and we ask, as always, for your understanding that not everybody can be pleased. We do try to work as much together with our members and stake holders as possible.

In November NZ Water Polo delivered a Club Development Weekend for Palmerston North and Manawatu. Coaching sessions and a stake holders presentation were on the programme. Palmerston North and Manawatu were not able to be part of the 2010 Coaches on Tour and this weekend was a very suitable solution to ensure our youngest water polo region and its players had access to these developmental opportunities.

Competition

Through our competitions (national championships and other, international events) NZWP promotes our sport in general and more specific participation.

NZWP has the deliberate strategy to generate a modest surplus from its competitions, as an important funding source for the association and its administration and also other areas of spending such as high performance.

A full cycle of national championships was completed during this reporting period, as well as the 2010 Panasonic Pan Pacific Youth Water Polo Festival and the 2nd NZ Masters.

In 2011/11 187 teams competed in our national championships compared to 185 in 2009/10, a slight increase.

A special note for the newly formed Wharenui club who, in their first participation, took the bronze medal in the U14 Div.2 Girls' Championships.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A) Reporting

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the reporting requirements of Section 11 of the Financial Reporting Act 1993. The association qualifies for differential reporting exemptions based on the following criteria:

- It is not publicly accountable and

B) Reporting Entity

The New Zealand Water Polo Association Incorporated is an incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

C) Measurement Base

D) Specific Accounting Policies

Accounts receivable are stated at estimated realisable value after providing against debts where collection is doubtful.

Valuation of Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for damaged and obsolete stock.

Goods & Services Tax

These financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis where all items in the Revenue Accounts have been recorded exclusive of GST as have Stock on Hand and Fixed Assets (used principally for business purposes) in the Statement of Financial Position inclusive of GST.

Fixed Assets

Non-current assets are included at cost less Accumulated Depreciation. Depreciation is calculated using the following rates:

Jack Mazzoleni passed away June 2011

Jack Mazzoleni, Life Member and one-time Patron of NZ Water Polo, died unexpectedly on 9 June 2011.

Jack was a good guy. Mazz, as he was universally known, was friendly, thoughtful and caring. He was also amazingly generous, quietly helping water polo players, swimmers and others to become involved and to enjoy trips which, but for him, they could not afford.

Jack loved to recount stories about people, places and teams. There was a lot to tell. He started his water polo career in 1942, war-time, with juniors able to make quite a splash. One of the biggest problems then, according to Jack, was the weight of the heavy, invariably water-logged, leather balls. He was still involved 69 years later.

Mazz played for the Waitemata Swimming Club. For many years it fielded one of the strongest teams in NZ and he was in the 1957 team which won the Ryan Cup. Jack also played for Auckland many times in an era when players were hard men, fights were common and the lonesome referees often struggled to keep the combatants apart – during and after matches. Swimming speed was a definite advantage in helping Jack to get out of trouble.

At his first national championships (in Invercargill) a youthful and eager Jack was told: 'You mark Bill Dyson' – who happened to be the top player in NZ at the time. 'It was a real heavy game. They threw the ball up to Bill and I was holding him everywhere and he flicked the ball into the net with his foot.'

Jack's special forte was as a major promoter and organiser of junior and women's water polo. He encouraged senior players to coach and he helped to arrange tournaments throughout NZ. He was Chairman of the Auckland Water Polo Board and for a long period was coach and manager of numerous club, school and national teams. Awards from Auckland and NZ Swimming were just recognition for wonderful service.

Jack was a busy man. As well as having varied commercial interests, he was a foundation member of the North Piha Surf Club. He was a passionate about his football – at one stage coaching the Ponsonby fifth grade rugby team while at the same time playing for the Ponsonby senior rugby league team, at least until the rugby hierarchy forced him to cease his dual role. In more recent years, Mazz spent hours, usually at incredibly early times, swimming prodigious distances in the pool. His NZ masters records were testimony to his commitment.

However, always evident, right till the end, was an enthusiasm for water polo and all of the people involved. He will be sorely missed.
