QUALIFICATION OUTLINE FOR PARIS OLYMPICS 2024

The International Olympic Committee and World Aquatics (AQUA) have ratified and released the qualification criteria for Paris 2024. The host nation France reserves a direct quota place each in the men's and women's tournament with the remainder of the total quota attributed to the eligible NOCs through a tripartite qualification pathway.

The 2023 World Aquatics World Championships, scheduled for 16 to 29 July in Fukuoka, Japan will produce the winners and runners-up of the men's and women's water polo tournament qualifying for Paris 2024. Five further quota places will be awarded to the highest-ranked eligible NOC at each of the Continental Championships (Africa, Americas, Asia, Europe, and Oceania) approved by World Aquatics. If any of the Continental Championships does not occur within the qualifying period, the vacant spot will be entitled to the highest-ranked eligible NOC from a respective continent at the succeeding edition of the Worlds.

To complete the water polo roster for the Games, the final batch of quota places will be assigned to the four highest-ranked eligible NOCs for men and two for women at the 2024 World Aquatics Championships In Doha, Qatar.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY AND QUOTA

There are 2 teams entered from the Oceania region:

- New Zealand
- Australia

All athletes must comply with <u>World Aquatics Rules</u> and the <u>Olympic Charter</u> eligibility requirements. There will be 15 team members.

Full squad lists (15) to be submitted to the World Aquatics Delegate at the Technical Delegates meeting along with all passports.



Team lists (13) to be submitted to the World Aquatics Delegate no later than 90 minutes before the start of the each game.

SWIMWEAR AND ADVERTISING

All competitors of the Qualification series shall abide by the relevant World Aquatics competition regulations pertaining to swimwear and advertising.

MEDICAL AND DOPING

Medical services will be on call at the venue during the whole competition.

After hours medical care is available at Shorecare Accident and Medical Centre from 6.00pm-7.30 am, weekdays weekends and public holidays.

Athletes can be requested to take a doping test at any time during the competition. A number of tests and types of samples and analyses are at the sole discretion of the World Aquatics and/or International Testing Agency.

If a certain player has been determined to do the test, he will be escorted by the doping chaperones to the Medical & Doping designated areas at the venue.
